Upon motion duly made, seconded, and unanimously approved, the following bills were paid from the General Fund Account. (Attached and a part of these minutes)

C. Mr. Laufer presented the District Treasurer's Report- Money Market Accounts -Tri Counties Bank- (Land-Based) balance is \$220,257.93 @ 3.44% plus adjustment of 1.01%, and Tri Counties Bank account-balance is \$1,166,933.28 @ 3.44% plus adjustment of 1.01%. LAIF balance is \$631,245.48 as of 2/5 @ 4.37%. Total in Reserves \$2,018,436.69. The balance in the Kanawha checking account is \$480,625.96 and Kanawha-KGPFA checking account \$3,973.35. The interest rate on the Money Market Accounts will be 4.355% with an annual percentage yield of 4.45% starting 01/17 to 02-14-25, then will be reviewed every thirty days.

- 1. The water use in January was 3 acre-feet of 3F Tier 2 M&I, to date (Jan-) 3 acre-feet M&I of which was 3F Water. Also, presented the Historical Water Use by Month.

- 3. Mr. Laufer reported field staff have been doing maintenance on equipment trailers, Mr. Chavez is finishing meter inspection on laterals 1. Lely has finished the upgrade to Lateral 1 Plant along with Invonative Controls (ISCADA INC). Put the system to the test on Tuesday a few glitches worked out and system worked for frost Tuesday night. Pumped down Lateral 5 pumping plant did some repairs otherwise all looked in good shape. Mr. Laufer asked the TC Canal to clean drain on Road 57 in January and February.

Also, Mr. Laufer reported Annexation information on Jerry Hanks property, and on standpipes going in on Elworthy and Hillgate property to be on March agenda.

- 6. Mr. Laufer presented the reservoir levels for February 11<sup>th</sup> Trinity Lake was at 2,020,000 acre-feet compared to last year at 1,623,000 acre-feet. Shasta Lake was at 3,836,000 acre-feet compared to last year at 3,784,000 acre-feet with the 15-year average at 127%. Oroville was at 2,827,000 acre-feet compared to last year at 2,778,000 acre-feet with the 15-year average at 132%. The total North CVP was at 8,979,000 acre-feet compared to last year at 8,849,000 acre-feet. Rain total October to date 55.08 inches.
- 7. Mr. Hansen reported on meeting for the Glenn Groundwater Authority. Also, groundwater readings were presented.
